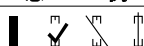

Americans and Japanese do not think about being different in the same way. While it is often said in Japan that a nail that sticks up will be hammered down, in America people like unique things. This is also true for places. Other cities might dislike being called “weird,”* but Austin, the capital of Texas, is proud to be weird.

Austin had always been known as a cool town, not very expensive and full of creative people. After a sudden tech boom in the 90s, housing got very expensive, and many chain stores moved in. People did not like this because those stores were not unique to Austin. As a result, the public tried to support local businesses. Moreover, they encouraged the creativity of artists and musicians. They wanted to stop any growth that could make Austin less special. The phrase, “Keep Austin Weird,” was created to oppose all the development.

Although Austin has been one of the fastest growing cities in America for the past 10 years, it still has plenty of weirdness and creativity. There is a Cathedral of Junk—the name says it all. It is basically a museum filled with what people have thrown away. Locals also have unique ideas regarding food. They believe the taco can be breakfast food! There are many taco restaurants with breakfast tacos on the menu.

As for creative festivals, Austin has two of the best. The first is the Austin City Limits Music Festival that started in 2002 as a weekend celebration. Since 2013, it has been held over two weekends and is attended by around 450,000 people. The second is the SXSW (South by Southwest). The festival began in 1987 as a one-day music event and now lasts 10 days. The festival awards include an interactive prize, a music prize, and, perhaps the most famous, a film prize.

So, if you need to add a little weirdness and creativity to your life, come meet some Austinites over a breakfast taco. I’m sure you will leave more than a little inspired.
